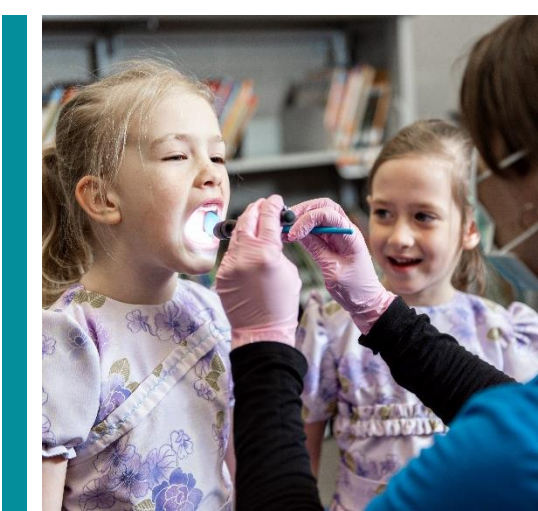


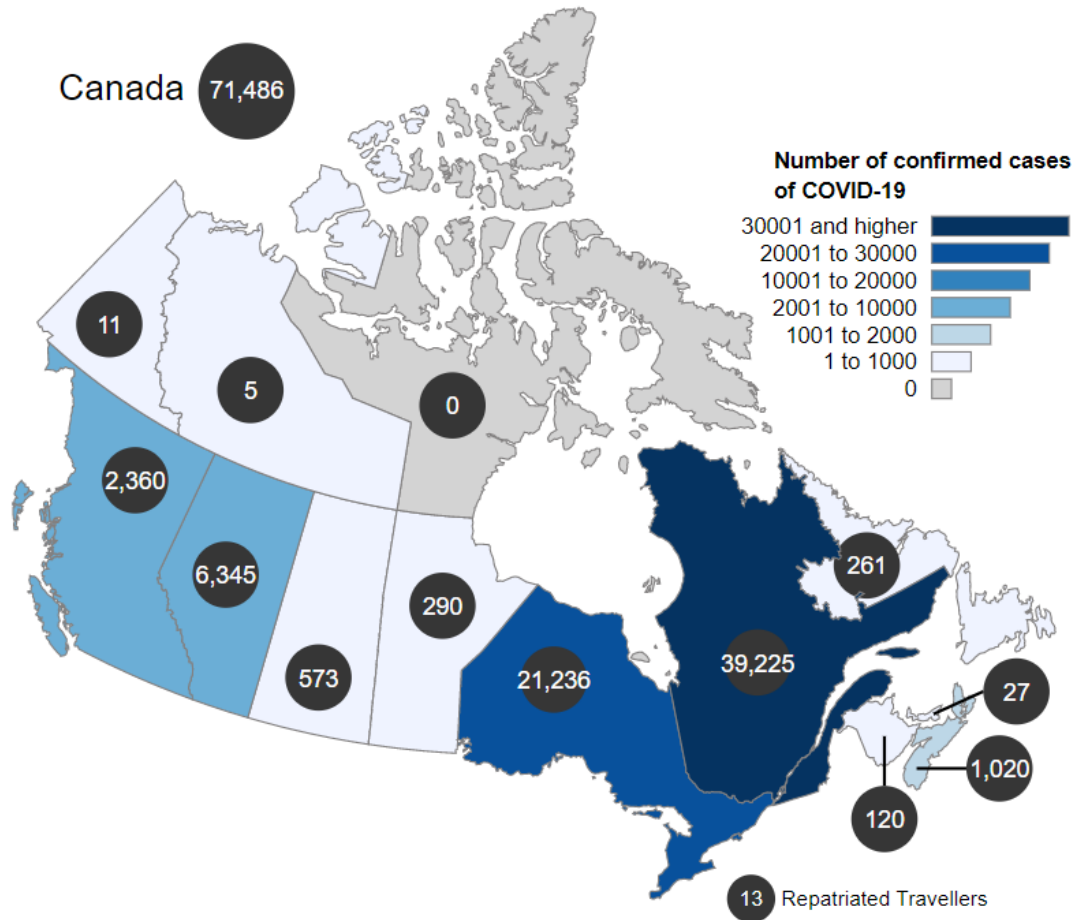
High risk areas in Canada for COVID-19

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Number of confirmed cases



Ontario

- **Health units with rates >120.1 per 100,000 population:**
 - ▶ **Windsor-Essex:** 64% of cases reside in Windsor, 13% Kingsville
 - ▶ **Lambton:** 73% of cases reside in the urban areas of Sarnia, Bright's Grove and Point Edward
 - ▶ **Haldimand-Norfolk:** 60% of cases are related to the Anson Place Care Centre outbreak in Hagersville (as of April 17 – most recent detailed update)
 - ▶ **Waterloo:** highest rate is in Kitchener
 - ▶ **Peel:** 52% of cases in Mississauga and 45% in Brampton
 - ▶ **Toronto:** high risk areas within not specified
 - ▶ **York:** highest rates in Vaughan and Newmarket
 - ▶ **Durham:** highest rate is in Pickering
 - ▶ **Leeds-Grenville-Lanark:** 60% of cases from institutional outbreaks
 - ▶ **Ottawa:** high risk areas within not specified

Note: some websites provide rates and others only provide percent of all cases by location – it is expected that there would be more cases in urban areas because there are more people; rates account for the differences in population size to be able to make comparisons between areas.

Quebec & Eastern Canada

- **Quebec:** highest number of cases in Canada
 - ▶ 51% of cases in Montréal
 - ▶ 12% of cases in Montérégie
 - ▶ 11% of cases in Laval
 - ▶ 8% of cases in Lanaudière

- **Eastern Canada:** low number of cases relative to the rest of Canada
 - ▶ Most cases in Nova Scotia (85% in central zone including Halifax area, Eastern Shore and West Hants)

British Columbia & Alberta

- **British Columbia:** fewer cases than Ontario

- ▶ 48% of cases in Fraser and 37% in Coastal Vancouver

- **Alberta:** fewer cases than Ontario

- ▶ the highest rate is in the south zone (Lethbridge and Medicine Hat) followed by Calgary

Saskatchewan & Manitoba

- **Saskatchewan:** low number of cases relative to the rest of Canada
 - ▶ 54% in north and far north areas (Prince Albert, Melfort, North Battleford, Meadow Lake and La Ronge)
 - ▶ 28% of cases in Saskatoon area (including Humboldt)
 - ▶ 13% of cases in Regina

- **Manitoba:** low number of cases relative to the rest of Canada
