1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 11:02 a.m. by Amanda VandenWyngaert, acting chair.

2. Confirmation of Members Terms

Brian reports that County Council accepted revisions to the Museum's governing by-law to increase representation for County museums by one member, making two representatives and to decrease at-large representation from two members to one.

Jennifer Beauchamp, the new museum liaison committee member was introduced. Jennifer is curator at the Port Burwell Marine Museum and museum assistant at the Ingersoll Cheese and Agricultural Museum/Oxford Museum School. Committee members introduce themselves to Jennifer.

8. Curator's Report

Mike Baker updated members on museum projects.

a) Brief Overview of the 2021 Annual Report

Overall attendance was 432 visitors for the roughly half year we were actually open to the public. Without programming and events to promote the exhibitions, the numbers dropped off precipitously.

Given the closures we resorted where possible to on-line programming including for example the cycling tour of Malahide we created with Onthisspot last summer.

Other Programming Highlights -

During lockdowns in the early part of the year, we were able to communicate much of the content of the exhibitions through social media. Followers for our Twitter and Facebook feeds are both up.

In the fall I put together a talk on Elgin County and London WWI memorials for the RCR museum lecture series. It was presented live in London for the Women's Canadian Club on November, 11th to about 350 women with another 65 watching on live-stream. And once more to a meeting of the Golden K Kiwanis in January.

Inspired by the recent donation of several memorials including the 91st chapel and honour rolls from the Rodney Legion. There is a potential for an online exhibition. Part of the county-wide checklist of cultural assets.

b) 2022 to Date

Highlight for this year to date has been the organization and launch of an online Black history tour. The museum was invited to assist with a guide to Black History sites in this part of Ontario – while we have very few, both Port Burwell and Port Stanley were landing points for many formerly enslaved persons. And there is some record of specific individuals arriving there.

We redesigned the project to fit the requirements of the Healthy Communities Fund, an application to which was made by Museum London on behalf of the partners. The grant allowed the partners to retain Onthisspot to create tours in three locations using content developed by the partners.

Thanks to launching in several communities the tours received very good press coverage. An interview with Global News was picked up Culture Days and resulted in the tour's listing in their national on-line newsletter.

Family Day was a slow start to recovery. This event normally hosted approximately 70 visitors, we did not promote to ensure we could follow Covid protocols. For March Break, we will have wider promotion.

c) Upcoming Programming

Vimy Lecture proposal – Saturday, April 9th, 2022.

Recommends Blair Ferguson to share what he does with the students at St. Joe's. He had the entrance signs to Wallacetown note the VC and Ellis. A live stream for the talk will be arranged.

Bike Fair in St. Thomas – Saturday, May 14th, 2022.

Might exhibit the high wheel and a bike history banner at the event, held at the Horton Street Farmers Market.

Exhibits

Space to Spoon has had a slow start, 54 visitors attended for the month of February.

Baker Picnic opens April 16 – Ingenium has offered a free extension for Space to Spoon, we will possibly run both shows at the same time.

9. Bushell Projects

Three of the murals (of 6) have been completed and installed.

Two others are nearing completion. Yet to commission the remaining locations -Rodney and Dutton.

Augmented Reality – EXAR is working on the detailed art for the Port Stanley adventures. Working on two others related to the museums -the Ontario Hospital and the VC. EXAR expects to be ready for draft presentation on March 25th and launch, if all looks good, sometime around the middle of April with a “louder launch” in June.

Outdoor Learning Area - will be completed this year. Have had initial contact with South Dorchester School, will meet with them to view their outdoor space weather permitting.

Conservation – we viewed the first work to be completed in October; sufficient funds to complete a second smaller work.

Digital Archivist has been working on the Stollery photograph collection.

Database

Oneida Language and Culture Centre is now one of the online database partners. We are also assisting with building exhibition furniture for the Centre.

10. Storage / Facility Planning

Brian Masschaele reported on planning for improvements to the museum's collection storage.

Fiona Murray has been hired on a one-year contract funded through the Bushell Estate to conduct a collection review. She started in February.

Fiona is reviewing artifacts in the collection to ensure that they fit the museum's mandate, are in adequate condition, and have proper documentation, before potentially deaccessioning any

items.

This project is an ongoing incentive to start reviewing the museum's needs before approaching council with a strategic plan for the future. The renovations at the County Administration Building are starting this year with the installation of new elevators. The impact renovations have on museum and archives services will be reviewed after the renovations are completed.

11. Museum Partner Reports

Amanda VandenWyngaert provided an Elgin County Museums Update, including partner events for the Aylmer-Malahide Museum and Archives; Backus Page House Museum, Edison Museum, Elgin County Railway Museum, Gay Lea Museum and Port Burwell Marine Museum.

Jennifer Beauchamp, as a museum liaison will take over reporting on Elgin County Museum updates, as Amanda is now committee chair.

Sally Martyn reports on the Sparta Forge and Anvil Museum and The Sparta Church and Cultural Centre.

Student summer job opportunities have been advertised, they should have two students to open both sites for the 2022 season. One interview is being conducted this week.

Last year the students had an opportunity to update the Church with the new exhibit Pioneer Know How. This exhibit will likely stay installed as it had a short season last year with closures. Students may have an opportunity to update the Forge and Anvil Museum this year, exhibits are usually the history of Sparta.

They are hoping to hold their annual fundraising events, the High Tea and Fashion Show in May and the Feast at the Forge dinner in November, pending Covid protocols.

13. Committee Member Reports

Donna reports that Women's Institutes have met twice via zoom and have been able to make donations in the community.

Joan shares that this year the Women's Institutes are celebrating 125 years.

A press release sharing the history of the Women's Institutes' efforts of supporting and inspiring women was shared to local news media. A few journalists have reached out to write

stories.

Roger's TV will be conducting an interview for International Women's Day.


