



Notice of Project Commencement: Centennial Ave & Elm Line Roundabout

Dear Property Owner/Resident,

The County of Elgin and the Municipality of Central Elgin would like to inform you that construction of the planned roundabout at the intersection of Centennial Avenue and Elm Line will commence on the week of April 3, 2023. The County's contractor L82 plans to complete the roundabout by June 30, 2023.

Updated Work Details

- Construction of a single lane roundabout
- Storm sewer replacement/installation
- Sidewalk replacement
- Central Island featuring a pollinator garden
- Tree plantings
- Sanitary sewer/service upgrades

Proposed Project Timeline

- Construction Start: Week of April 3, 2023
- Planned Completion: June 30, 2023

Project Updates

Construction of the Centennial and Elm roundabout will commence, weather permitting, during the week of April 3, 2023. In the coming weeks, the contractor will begin preparatory activities, such as installing advanced notice signs, project signs, temporary speed cushions on Coulter, and detour signs along the proposed route. Hydro One will return to the site on March 20th to remove one last pole marked for relocation. The opening week(s) of construction will see a flurry of activity, including the mobilization of required equipment, delivery of materials to the site, and removal of existing infrastructure. The intersection will be closed to through traffic but will remain open to local traffic. For your safety, we kindly ask that you remain patient and follow the directions given by the contractor. The County and contractor will endeavor to maintain driveway access whenever possible. However, there may be occasions where work will require the temporary restriction of driveway access. The contractor will provide notification at least 24 hours in advance of these restrictions.
